

The Historic Liberty Jail is a sacred place to members of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-Day Saints. It was here that the prophet leader, Joseph Smith, along with Sidney Rigdon, Hyrum Smith, Alexander McRae, Lyman Wight, and Caleb Baldwin spent the bitter winter of 1838-1839. They were

unjustly charged with treason while their families and church members were forced from Missouri. The Historic Liberty Jail was a place of painful refining for Joseph

Smith and his companions. As Joseph tried to pen words of consolation to the suffering saints, revelation and comfort were received.
